

# 6.2 Storage Zone Map & Labeling Guide

## Zones 1–3

A structured map for organizing trauma supplies, routine medical care, and long-term overflow storage using clear zones and color coding.

Zone	Purpose	Contents Examples	Color Code	Location Notes
Zone 1 — Trauma	Immediate emergencies	Tourniquet, trauma pads, CPR mask	Red	One per floor or vehicle
Zone 2 — Main Cabinet	General care & meds	OTC meds, tools, wound care	Blue	Locked, temperature stable
Zone 3 — Overflow	Resupply & backups	Refills, ORS, gloves, batteries	Green	Sealed bins, labeled

- Label each item with Name / Use / Expiry.
- Use colored tape matching the zone.
- Keep trauma supplies visible and unobstructed.
- Store meds in dry, moderate temperature zones.
- Use humidity packs for long-term supplies.

[RED — Zone 1 Trauma] Top Shelf → Trauma kit, gloves, saline [BLUE — Zone 2 Main Cabinet] Middle Shelf → OTC meds, tools, eye care [GREEN — Zone 3 Overflow] Bottom Shelf → Refills, ORS, backups

Area	Assigned Zone	Primary Keeper	Last Checked	Notes

- Trauma kit visible & intact
- Main cabinet organized & labeled
- Overflow containers sealed & dated
- Expired supplies moved to review bag
- Backup lighting available near each zone
